



Security advices – Regulations

Pedal Sea Bike

1. Are prohibited for individuals younger than fourteen (14) years of age if and adult is not present and when individuals cannot swim properly.
2. Are prohibited when distances from the shoreline are greater than five hundred (500) meters.
3. Are prohibited during adverse weather conditions and prior to sunrise and after sunset hours.
4. When the number of occupants is greater than the maximum number specified by the manufacturer.
5. Sea Bike operators must show proper care and caution so as to avoid disturbing swimmers in the area.

Windsurf

1. Is prohibited to individuals younger than sixteen (16) years of age and who cannot swim properly. For minors, individuals under the minimum age, the parents or guardians maintain responsibility, must provide parental consent, in addition to confirming the minors ability to swim properly.
2. Is prohibited during adverse weather conditions and prior to sunrise and after sunset hours.
3. Are required to wear a specially designed Personal Floatation Device (PFD) e.g. lifejacket
4. Windsurfing is prohibited when distances are less than Two Hundred (200) meters from the customary locations accessed and frequented by swimmers when at coastlines where floating buoys are not evident. When at beaches where floating buoys are mandatory, windsurfing is allowed beyond such markers.
5. When launching or returning to shore, proper care and caution is exercised by the windsurfer so as to avoid disturbing swimmers in the area.

Canoe

1. Are prohibited for individuals unable to swim properly and when and when under fourteen (14) years of age.
2. Are prohibited when distances from the shoreline are greater than five hundred (500) meters.
3. Are prohibited during adverse weather conditions and prior to sunrise and after sunset hours.
4. Are prohibited in cases where the number of individuals surpasses the number specified by the manufacturer for the specific model and type. Individuals or paddlers must be equipped with Personal Floatation devices.
5. Paddlers must exercise proper care and caution so as to avoid disturbing swimmers in the area.

Stand Up Paddling (SUP)

1. Is prohibited when
 - α. Individuals do not know how to swim and when under fourteen (14) years of age.
 - β. Distances traveled exceed five hundred (500) meters from the shoreline.
 - γ. Severe or adverse weather conditions prevail and during the hours prior to sunrise and after sunset.
 - δ. More than one (1) individual is on board.
 - ε. Personal floatation devices are not worn.
 - στ. Board is equipped with sails.
2. The operator/paddler must show proper care and exercise caution so as to avoid any disturbances or commotion to swimmers in the area.

Sailing – Sailing boat

1. Is prohibited when

(α) Individuals operating the sailboat are less than sixteen (16) years of age and when they cannot swim. Individuals less than the minimum age requirement can board in cases when:

i. Such individuals/minors can swim properly and only when they are accompanied by adults

ii. Such sailboats are leased, the parents/ legal guardians ultimately maintain responsibility and must provide parental consent, in addition to confirming the minors' ability to swim properly. Their use is restricted to One Thousand (1000) meters from the launching point on shore and must be visible and monitored by the lessor at all times.

(β) During severe or adverse weather conditions and during the hours prior to sunrise and after sunset.

(γ) Distances are less than Two Hundred (200) meters from the customary locations accessed and/or frequented by swimmers. When at beaches where floating buoys are mandatory, sailing is allowed only beyond such markers.

2. Sailboats must be registered with B.E.M.Σ. Hellenic Port Authority and must display the vessels name on both sides along with the assigned registration number.

3. Passengers on sailboats must wear personal flotation devices.

4. Sailboats must meet and adhere to the standard emergency and safety/fire equipment requirements in addition to the maximum allowed number of passengers as noted on the respective operating license. Leased vessels that stay within the one thousand (1000) meter perimeter from the shoreline and which are visible and constantly monitored by the lessor, are excluded from the requirement regarding standard emergency and safety/fire equipment but continue to satisfy the previous paragraphs conditions.
